History

SEA SCAMP, original name ZEISIG, used by the Luftwaffe for navigation training 1936-44. After WW2, she taken by British Forces as war reparations and sailed back to England as part of the WINDFALL fleet. Renamed SEA SCAMP she was used by the ROYAL NAVY, ROYAL MARINES & SEA CADETS for sail training. In 1984 she was purchased by a group of enthusiasts who formed the SEA SCAMP SYNDICATE.

For the last 37 years she has been based at Shamrock Quay and cruises around the Solent on spring and autumn weekends with extended summer cruises - changing crew each week – Channel Islands, Normandy, Brittany, East Coast & Holland, West Country & the Isles of Scilly, Ireland, Western Scotland.
